

## Dutch efforts to strengthen land governance

### <u>In developing countries</u>:

 Embassy programs strengthening the implementation and development of land policies in Mozambique, Ethiopia, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi and Benin, but also in Colombia, Bangladesh and Indonesia;

#### At global level:

- Support to Global Land Tool Network (GLTN) since 2013; EUR 20 million up to mid 2018;
- Continued support to the International Land Coalition; USD 3 million for 2016-2018;
- Support to the Land Rights Now initiative; at UNGA, WEF and COP 22
- Promote inclusion of land governance indicators in especially SDG's 1 and 5; in close collaboration with the Global Donor Working Group on Land



# Dutch efforts to strengthen land governance

#### In The Netherlands:

- Promote Fit-For-Purpose land administration through LAND partnership with Kadaster; EUR
  0.9 million 2015-2018
- Increased support to Women's Land Rights; international expert meeting in Apeldoorn; launch of a EUR 0.5 million WLR project in March 2017
- Continued supported to LANDac; EUR 1.5 million for 2016-2021;
- Participating in the Dutch Multi-Stakeholder LANDdialogue (EUR 0.5 million).
- Increased attention to land issues in International Corporate Social Response agreements



### Overall results:

- → 750.000 people obtain increased tenure security on an annual basis
- → Increased knowledge on land governance issues in NL banks, pension funds, ngo's, corporates, universities, ministries, government agencies
- → Increased partnerships between NL actors in strengthening land governance aspects
- → Increased partnerships between NL actors and other actors in strengthening land governance aspects
- → Increased awareness that strengthening land governance is crucial for poverty reduction, food security, stability, inclusive economic development, gender equality, combating climate change, natural resources management, urbanisation, migration dynamics etc
